Kost is a Principal Evangelist at Adobe Systems and is an accomplished photographer and fine artist. She has received the Gerhard Bakker award from the Professional Photographers of America and was granted the title of Honorary Educational Associate from the American Society of Photographers.

About the Photograph:

The Fallen Fawn is Andres' most recent melodrama inspired by formative childhood memories. In this series of lush, cinematic work, Andres illustrates the tale of her two older sisters who as adolescent girls found an abandoned suitcase containing a woman's belongings near the river behind their house. "This story has all the narrative motifs that most interest me, and so I set out to make a body of work inspired by it."

About the Artist:

Holly Andres' images rely on a tension between an apparently approachable subject matter and a darker, sometimes disturbing subtext. She has had solo exhibitions in New York, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Atlanta, Seattle, Istanbul and Portland Oregon where she lives and works. Her work has been featured in *The New York Times Magazine*, *Time, Art in America, Artforum, Art News, Oprah Magazine, The LA Times, Glamour, Blink* and *Art Ltd.* – which profiled her as one of 15 emerging West Coast artists under the age of 35.

About the Photograph:

"The Sweetheart Roller Skating Rink photographs speak to a transitional moment in the American South and in the arts. The importance of these images lies within the Southern tradition of storytelling made powerfully real through the magic of photography. With his camera, Yates has memorialized the wild and wonderful skaters of Sweetheart and the uniqueness of pre-gentrified Florida. A chance encounter between a college photography student and a Florida skating rink in 1972 has produced one of the definitive visual records of youth culture in the American South." About the Artist:

Bill Yates (b. 1946) studied with Garry Winogrand, Aaron Siskind and Harry Callahan, and earned his MFA in photography in 1975 at RISD. His first major solo exhibition was at the Corcoran Gallery of Art in 1975. A portfolio of images from his Sweetheart series was named a 2013 Photolucida Critical Mass Top 50 winner. Bill Yates: Sweetheart Roller Skating Rink 1972-1973 opened at the Ogden Museum of Southern Art in New Orleans last October and the first edition hardcover book will be published this fall by Atlanta's Fall Line Press. An exhibition of Sweetheart images is currently on view in Atlanta at Hathaway Contemporary Gallery. Yates' work is held in numerous museum, corporate, and private collections across the county.

About the Photograph:

About the Artist:

Born in Glen Cove, New York in 1958, Halliday attended Syracuse University and pursued further studies under the tutelage of Arnold Newman. He has exhibited widely in solo and group exhibitions throughout the United States and Europe. In 2002, the Contemporary Arts Center in New Orleans exhibited a retrospective of his work and in 2012, he exhibited at the Ogden Museum of Southern Art, New Orleans. Halliday's work is included in numerous public and private collections including the New Orleans Museum of Art; the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, and the New Britain Museum of Art.

About the Photograph:

This was taken at Pershing Point at fruit stand in front of a parking lot. I had just gotten an NEA fellowship and would walk around with pockets full of Kodachrome. In my opinion, only now does the technology exist to make a print from Kodachrome worthy of exhibition.

About the Artist:

Chip Simone met photographer Harry Callahan at RISD a little over 50 years ago, which changed the direction of his life. In 2011, Simone was given an exhibition at the High Museum of Art which holds 42 of his prints in its collection. Other collections include the Museum of Contemporary Art of Georgia (MOCA GA), the Houston Museum of Fine Art, the Museum of Modern Art in New York, and the Sir Elton John Collection.

In 2016, Simone guest curated "Edge to Edge" a state-wide survey of contemporary Georgia photography exhibited at MOGA GA. Two books of Simone's photographs have been published: On Common Ground, Photographs from the Crossroads of the New South (1996), and Chroma (2011). A career retrospective of his work is being planned for 2017.

About the Photograph:

Her most recent series, *Rewriting History*, seeks to reconnect viewers to the past so that parallels with current events are amplified. Do Black lives matter even in the 21st century? In this haunting photographic essay, Jean-Louis has created paper sculptures styled to mimic garments worn by female European nobility between the 15th – 19th centuries. Through the materials used for the paper gown sculptures, which represent layers of time and events of the past, she suggests that we can act to change the present as we activate the memories, visions, and legacies of our ancestors.

About the Artist:

Fabiola Jean-Louis (b. 1978) is a Haitian born fine artist and photographer currently based out of Brooklyn, NY. Jean-Louis is already making waves as a visionary who can manifest diverse patterns of space-time, sci-fi, costume design and surrealism within the worlds of her art. Fabiola's work has been featured in AfroPunk, Blerds, ArtInsomniac, and commissioned for books, several album covers, branding, and now model portfolios. With a style that is haunting, dreamy and mysterious, along with her talent for visual storytelling, Jean-Louis stands out as an artist to be watched

About the Photograph:

This haunting view of night traffic streaming over the Astoria-Megler Bridge captures the remoteness that originally helped dub it the "Bridge to Nowhere." Spanning the Columbia River, it's the longest truss bridge in North America and was the final link to complete U.S. Route 101 from Canada to Mexico. Photographer Phillip Jones spent three pleasant days in Astoria waiting for the right conditions to capture this image. Its part of his series of infrastructural landscapes.

About the Artist:

Phillip Jones (b.1951) received a Sears Foundation scholarship to study with painter Gene Davis each Saturday for a year during High School. Afterwards, he studied at the Corcoran School of Art, Antioch College and Cooper Union. He also began to exhibit his paintings.

In 1990 Phillip began exhibiting his photographic work which has been shown in the Decordova Museum, the Lafayette Museum, the Hunter Museum, the Boston Center for the Arts, the Federal Reserve Gallery and Photographic Resource Center, with fourteen solo exhibits at the Mercury Gallery. His recent exhibit, "Urban Shapes" was at the Anzenberger Gallery, in Vienna, Austria.

About the Photograph:

He has described this body of work as, "more like a haiku rather than a prose."

About the Artist:

The English photographer Michael Kenna is well known for his black-and-white landscapes, taken in locations all over the world. Kenna's photographs are often made at dawn or in the dark hours of night with exposures up to 10 hours.

These expressive portraits were collected in Steidl's 2015 monograph, *Mississippi History*.

About the Artist:

Maude Schuyler Clay was born in Greenwood. Mississippi. After attending the University of Mississippi and the Memphis Academy of Arts, she assisted the photographer William Eggleston. She moved to New York City and worked at LIGHT Gallery and then as a photography editor and photographer for Esquire, Fortune, Vanity Fair, and other publications. She returned to live in the Mississippi Delta in 1987 and received the Mississippi Arts and Letters award for photography in 1988, and in 1992. The University Press of Mississippi published her widely recognized monograph DELTA LAND in 1999, which received the Mississippi Arts and Letters Award in 2000. Her work is in the collections of The Museum of Modern Art, The Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, and The National Museum for Women in the Arts, among others. She continues to live in the Delta with her husband and three children.



Frances F. Denny (b. 1984) is an artist whose work investigates the development of female selfhood and identity. The *Pink Crush* series describes the visual iconography of late 20th-century girlhood, reflecting the ways in which esthetics of an era shape a developing sense of self. Frances is the recipient of a 2016 NYFA Fellowship in Photography, and has won numerous awards, including PDN's 30: New and Emerging Photographers to Watch (2016), PDN's 2015 The Curator (for Still Life), LensCulture Emerging Talent (2015), Magenta Foundation Flash Forward (2015), and Critical Mass Top 50 (2015). She holds an MFA from Rhode Island School of Design. Her work has been featured by The New York Times, Art New England, PDN, and on the 2016 Photoville Fence on the Atlanta Beltline. David Egan (b. 1982) is a San Francisco-based, American photographer who creates long-term bodies of work focusing on the American West. Most recently he has been traveling through Nevada, capturing an array of classic imagery ranging from nostalgic commercial scenes to vacant landscapes. He has become known for his rich color saturated images and his long exposure night photography. David holds an MFA from Academy of Art University, San Francisco and a BA in Organizational Communications from Rollins College. His work has been published in Aint-Bad Magazine and Incandescent. Andrew Feiler - Atlanta, GA Missing Maps and More - Fountain Hall, 2012

Andrew Feiler is a fifth generation Georgian from Savannah whose work focuses on the contemporary complexities of the American South. His award-winning book *Without Regard to Sex, Race or Color*, published in 2015 by The University of Georgia Press, gives us a sensitive view about the too often troubled status of historically black colleges and universities. Feiler has an MBA from Stanford University, a Master of Studies in Modern History from Oxford University in England and a BS in Economics from University of Pennsylvania, Wharton School. He has a long history of community engagement in the arts, business, civic and public policy arenas. His photography is included in numerous private and corporate collections including the Atlanta University Center Robert W. Woodruff Library and Emory University.
